For the 12-day CAP, one activity with overnight stay will take place (moment to be confirmed.)



GENERAL INFORMATION

What to expect from the CAP??

The Cadet Activity Program (or CAP) consists of activities offered in your community for first- and second-year cadets. During five or twelve days, you will have the opportunity to live experiences directly related to the local training program. In the 12-day CAPs, an activity with overnight stay (max 3) will also be offered.

Here is an overview of possible activities:

- Sports activities
- Marksmanship
- Drill
- Geocaching
- Elemental and Canadian Armed Forces familiarization specific day
- Team work
- And much more!

EACH ZONE HAS ITS OWN REALITY AND DISTINCT CAP Schedule. Cap-specific joining instructions will be sent.

FOR MORE INFORMATION, ASK YOUR CADET CORPS OR SQUADRON'S OFFICERS.

Note that in accordance with <u>CANCDTGEN005/22</u>, cadets must be adequately vaccinated against COVID-19 for overnight activities. Vaccination proof may be requested.

There may also be a requirement for a vaccination from some day activity providers. Cadets will be notified in advance.

CADET365 ACCOUNT




A CADET365 account will be necessary for certain distance learning items before arriving at the CTC.

Make sure to contact your officers to obtain your cadet email and password.







Cadets may leave the CTC with their parents/guardians after their end of camp ceremony. A confirmation must be submitted by the cadet in the week before departure.

Cadets returning by bus will be advised of the schedule and procedure 48 hours prior to departure.

TRANSPORTATION TO THE CTC

Dress During Travel

Cadets must travel in uniform (boots, pants, belt, shirt or gunshirt, name tag, element headdress.) Rank slip ons, jacket, tie and parade attributes should not be brought.



🚽 Group Travel

By June 13, Cadet Corps and Squadrons will be provided with group transportation dates and times for cadets going to CTCs. The majority of cadets will travel as a group by charter bus. An adult will be present on the buses. For some cadets, they will need to purchase the ticket themselves to travel by civilian transport: this will be indicated in the transport orders in Fortress.

For cadets traveling outside of Quebec, you will receive relevant travel itinerary information from your contact officer. If you still do not have information a week before departure, please contact them.

Travel with Parents

Cadets residing in the immediate area of the CTC must present themselves at the CTC from the time indicated on the travel plan given by the Corps or Squadron. Parents who would like to drive their child directly to the CTC, even if there is a scheduled bus, should notify the point of contact as soon as possible.

🗙 Travel by Plane

You will receive additional instructions on baggage security during air transport from your contact officer. Cadets must have a valid government-issued photo ID. The name and date of birth must be indicated on the card. (Ex. RAMQ card) Cadets must also have their vaccination proof in order to travel on board an aircraft.

Training Allowance

Cadets will need to arrive at the Cadet Training Center with a void check and the Direct Deposit Form (CDT-130) in order to allow their training allowance to be paid by direct deposit and for and the reimbursement of transport costs for some cadets.

Please note that all cadets will receive, in cash, an amount of their allowance during camp to give them pocket money for their personal expenses. It is still recommended to bring an amount of approximately \$20 as pocket money to the CTC.

Some purchases may be charged directly to the training allowance (e.g. official group outings.)

DISCIPLINE

All participants must abide by the regulations promulgated by the authorities of the CTC including the rules of community life and the Code of Conduct.



Consumption or possession of drugs, alcohol, non-prescription medication or energy drinks is prohibited.



Firearms and bladed weapons (penknives, knives, machetes, flares) are prohibited. Laser pointers, lighters and any other material used to light a flame are prohibited.



No tobacco products are sold in summer camp canteens. Possession and consumption of cannabis is prohibited for cadets. Programs are in place to encourage staff and cadets to quit smoking.



Primary medical services and emergency dental care are available at each CTC. When you receive the Participation Offer, it is important to declare any change in medical condition to the Medical Section. A wrongful declaration could, in some cases, lead to a return home before boarding or upon arrival at the center.



Medication

We strongly encourage cadets with prescription medications to use blister packs (Dispill). Many pharmacies offer this service free of charge. Otherwise, medication must be in its original container with the original label. It is requested that cadets arrive with enough medication to cover the entire camp period. Over-the-counter medication is permitted, but cadets may not keep them with them. Medicines must be in their original packaging, sealed and not expired. The form found in Annex C of CATO 16-04must be completed and signed by the parents prior to the cadet's arrival at the center.



Cadets with a medical condition that could cause anaphylactic shock **must** have two (2) Epipen in their possession as well as a copy of the emergency plan.



Vaccination

We recommend that cadets be up to date with their vaccinations according to the recommendations of their home province's immunization program. Cadets must bring their vaccination record or a copy of it.

In addition, as stated in CANCDTGEN 005/22 on COVID-19 Vaccination Requirements for Cadets, all cadets participating in overnight summer training or ship deployments must be vaccinated against COVID-19. Cadets should be prepared to present their proof of vaccination when they arrive at the start of the activity.

Glasses, contact lenses and frames

These items are considered the cadet's personal items. Consequently, it is strongly recommended that the cadet and their parents take out insurance for the repair or replacement of glasses. In addition, cadets who wear glasses must have a spare pair of glasses and a copy of the prescription with them. Cadets are responsible for their eyewear and must reduce the risk of loss and damage (e.g., by wearing a tether). In the event of damage during the stay at the center, the staff will coordinate the replacement with the parents and the costs incurred will be paid by the parents.
